We love children and want to include them whenever possible. Our convention, however, is geared for parent/teacher enrichment and learning, so we encourage you to make childcare arrangements for your children. Understanding that this is not always possible, we do offer a children's program - something not all states do. Please be aware that this program does fill up quickly and will NOT be available to those registering onsite.

<u>Infants under 24 months</u> are free and must be with their parents or caregivers at all times. No wristband or name badge will be issued for children in this category. Please step out of sessions if your child becomes noisy (even happy sounds) as our recording equipment is very sensitive. An area for nursing moms is located in the exhibit hall.

<u>Children ages 2-4 years old</u> may attend workshops with their parents, assuming they will remain quiet and not become a distraction to other paying adults. Name badges will be provided for these children.
