	Four Gospel Points	Why They Are Important
PROVES	1. Jesus DIED	To cleanse us from sin
	2. Jesus was BURIED	Demonstrates that He died
PROVES	3. Jesus ROSE from the dead	Showed that He was the Son of God who successfully defeated death
	4. Jesus APPEARED bodily to many people	Demonstrates that He rose from the dead
